# Minutes of a meeting of the Parish Lands Committee held at 7.45 pm on Tuesday 12th July 2022 at Loddon Hall, Twyford, RG10 9JA.

Present: Mr M Bray (Chairman), Mrs E Ashley & Mr T Winchester.

In attendance: Resident from Orpington Close.

1. Public Questions. A resident from Orpington Close complained about brambles from the allotments encroaching on her garden access alleyway and garden. It was noted that the Land Registry map shows a separate slip of land, under separate ownership, between the alley and the Council allotment boundary. The Council will not take responsibility for this overgrowth.

- **3. Declaration of interest in items on the agenda.** Mr M Bray declared an interest in item 7 as an allotment holder.
- **Minutes dated 14**th **June 2022.** Minutes approved as a true and accurate record. Proposed Mrs E Ashley, seconded Mr M Bray. Motion carried unanimously.

- **5.2** Running track request A resident requested a running track at King George V recreation ground for use by the children over the summer holidays. Unanimously approved £100 (from the Grounds Maintenance budget) for a 200m running track with 4 lanes to avoid the football pitches. This could, if successful, be budgeted for as an annual feature in the summer at both KGVR and Stanlake Meadow.

- £1,303.92 for a replacement aerial runway seat, spring and break should a replacement be required over the summer. Motion carried unanimously.

- **10.6** Vandalism to roundabout and antisocial behaviour involving throwing items at property in Hermitage Drive 30.06.22. Captured on CCTV reported to the Piggott school & Police. Crime reference DP-21875-22-4343-00. Noted.
- **10.7** To consider advice following letter about the Telecoms proposal (EE&H3G) a letter of statutory notice pursuant to paragraph 26 (3) of Schedule 3A of the Communications Act 2003 on behalf of EE and H3G was served, from DWF Law LLP, on the Council. This follows the Council's refusal to give permission for a trial hole to be dug in the wildflower area of King George V recreation ground. Legal advice at a cost of no more than £400, was approved by the Chairman in consultation with the clerk using his powers under the Financial Regulations. The legal advice was considered. It was unanimously agreed for the clerk to respond as recommended in the legal advice giving approval for the survey however this should not be taken that any future proposal for siting equipment on the site would be accepted.
